CHECK-IN between 10a.m. and noon on Saturday, June 20, 2009. You must prearrange any arrival outside of this time.

General Camper Information:

- **THINGS NOT TO BRING:** No personal electronic devices (including pagers, blackberrys, palm pilots, laptops, hand-held video games, portable DVD players, radios, CD players, MP3 players, iPods, or other electronic devices), magazines, novels, comic books, or pets permitted at camp. No hair dryers or other electrical hairstyle devices.
- Cell phones ARE permitted; but must remain off, except during free time. If you need to reach your child, please call the camp number 434-964-1186 and your child can call you back. Camp Director reserves right to withdraw that privilege.
- **DRESS CODE:** Please keep in mind as you are packing for camp that you should glorify God in all you do and the way you dress. Clothing that is too tight, short, or revealing is not acceptable. Please, no spaghetti straps or bare midriffs, no shorts, no blue jeans, no tight clothing, no low cut tops, no tank tops, no two-piece swim suits that show midriff, no low riders, and no skorts. Skirts and dresses need to cover the knee when seated.
- **THINGS TO BRING:** Bible, pencil or pen, bed clothing (sleeping bag/sheets & blanket, pillow, and air mattress), toiletry articles (toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, washcloths, towels, comb, etc), modest swimsuit with non-white t-shirt to wear over, flashlight, sunscreen and bug repellent, camera, Sunday clothes, jean skirt or khaki pants to wear with camp t-shirt during community service projects, clean clothes for each day.
- **Laundry facilities are NOT available for campers.**

ABSOLUTES - This camp is a place set apart unto God. As such, we give Him the glory for all that happens here. To this end, violations of the following **are cause for immediate removal from the camp** (in extreme cases we reserve the right to call local law enforcement as well).

- NO DRUGS
- NO ALCOHOL
- NO SMOKING
- NO VULGAR LANGUAGE
- NO FIRE OF ANY KIND
- NO VIOLENCE, FIGHTING, OR THREATS OF THE SAME
- NO STEALING
- NO WEAPONS (includes hatchets and knives)
- NO HORSEPLAY OR PRACTICAL JOKES
- NO DESTRUCTION OF CAMP PROPERTY
- NO TAGGING OR GRAFFITI

GENERAL RULES

- Use the Buddy System (NEVER go anywhere without a buddy and/or a staff member)

- Be on time for all camp activities—your schedule should be followed unless changed by the camp director
- Attendance at classes, devotionals, and recreational activities is required unless excused by the camp director
- All campers must be in their quarters during rest, study, and sleeping periods
- All campers and staff members must adhere to the camp dress code
- Tobacco, alcohol, and drugs are not permitted at camp (drugs prescribed by your physician must be given to the camp director upon arrival)
- Any sickness or injury must be reported to the camp director
- No student may share ANY medication with another student
- Willful destruction of property, wildlife, or plant life is prohibited
- Automobiles are to be locked and parked in specified areas only (keys must be turned over to the camp director upon arrival)
- Respect everyone and cooperate with your fellow campers and staff
- Make sure a staff member always knows where you are
- Do not go to the river, the pool, or near any other water source unless a staff member is with you
- Put all litter in trash cans to keep area clean
- Respect the property of others; stay out of another's belongings

We will send a confirmation via email shortly after your application has been accepted, and updates via email. The camp schedule, To Bring list, and detailed driving instructions will be on the website. Please check the website within the last weeks before camp starts. We are looking forward to a fun-filled learning week at camp.
